1. From what *story* or *event* do the following quotes or verses come from in the *Gospel of John*?

Story or Event	Quote or Verse
	<i>I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again.</i>
	<i>Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!</i>
	<i>His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."</i>
	<i>"Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared.</i>
	<i>Go now and leave your life of sin.</i>
	<i>Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst.</i>
	<i>Come and have breakfast!</i>
	<i>When Jesus said, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground.</i>
	<i>See, you are well again. Stop sinning or something worse may happen to you.</i>
	<i>I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies</i>
	<i>Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest . . . But now my kingdom is from another place.</i>
	<i>If I want him to remain alive until I return, what is that to you? You must follow me.</i>
	<i>Jesus said, "It is finished."</i>
	<i>"Woman," he said, "why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?"</i>
	<i>Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days.</i>

2. In what *chapter* of the *Gospel of John* can you find the following quotes or verses?

Chapter Number	Quote or Verse
	<i>I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty.</i>
	<i>I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.</i>
	<i>I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.</i>
	<i>On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink.</i>
	<i>My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me</i>
	<i>My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message . . . that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you.</i>
	<i>It is for your own good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counselor will not come to you.</i>

Explain your choice.
7. The **Overview Lesson** that began our study of John contained the following heart question:
 - ♥ John describes himself in terms of his relationship to Jesus, *the disciple whom Jesus loved*. How would you describe yourself in terms of *your* relationship to Jesus?

Is your answer **now** the *same* or *different* from the one you gave at the beginning of this study? How so?
8. Share with your group any areas in your life (**thoughts, attitudes, opinions, behavior**) that have changed as a result of your study in the Gospel of John. What made the difference?
9. If you were writing a book about Jesus' impact in your life, what would be some of the chapter titles?
10. All through the *Gospel of John* we see the response of people who came face-to-face with Jesus. Do you encounter Jesus differently than you did before? How so? How has your encounters with Jesus in this Gospel changed or affected you?
11. Now that you finished your study of this Gospel, what response might Jesus be inviting you to make? At this stage of your spiritual journey, how will you respond to Jesus' invitation, "Come, follow me."
12. **John 20:30-31** states John's purpose in writing this Gospel. Has this purpose been achieved in your life? How so?
13. What is something you do not want to forget about your study of the Gospel of John no matter what?
14. **Write a prayer** to Jesus expressing your gratitude for all that you have learned and experienced this year through your study of the Gospel of John. Listen for what Jesus saying to you.
